DEVIL'S BID FOR THE SINNERS — LOWRY'S TEXT

Tonight the topic will be "The Unpardonable Sin."
Wednesday afternoon, "The Works of the Devil;" Wednesday evening, "Excuses."

Today is being observed as a day of prayer. At 7:00 o'clock this morning was held a praise and prayer service at the tabernacle. At 9:30 prayer meetings were held in the homes in the city. This afternoon at the Tabernacle Mr. Lowry spoke again on "The Second Coming of Christ." A deep feeling of the presence and power of God's Holy Spirit pervades the entire city.

Yesterday afternoon at 1:00 o'clock Mr. Lowry addressed the students of the high school. His subject was "Character Building," and he emphasized the need of sterling qualities in the life of every young man and young woman in the world's work of the present day.

A large audience assembled last night to hear the evangelist deal with the amusement question again.

The special musical numbers were "Tis Midnight And On Olive's Brow," by the male quartet; and "The Spirit's Calls," by Professor Moody.

Mr. Lowry's text was, Heb. 11:24-26. He said in part:

"There are many other things used by the Devil to lead people into captivity than the three things that were spoken about in my sermon last Friday night. Perhaps my topic might be broadly called 'The Devil's Bid for a Man.' He bids for every man's life. Moses was brought up in every luxury

of Pharaoh's court, and the Devil made a high bid for his life. "Now Moses sacrificed many things in his choice. He sacrificed the advantages of being called the son of Pharaoh's daughter. He was not satisfied to sacrifice his principles of righteousness for a little political prestige and power.

"Every man has to make this choice between the enticements of the world and the way of righteousness. It takes strength and energy to say 'No' in the right way in the face of temptation.

"Again Moses sacrificed the enjoyment of the pleasures of sin. There is a certain amount of pleasure in sin, but it is because those who enjoy them know nothing higher. The man or woman who is truly born of God is not attracted by the siren music of the world, because Jesus Christ is filling their hearts to the exclusion of sinful things.

"Moses might have been called a millionaire, but he would not sacrifice his principles for wealth. Money will never satisfy you, men. If you get it honestly and use it rightly. God will bless you in it, but money itself cannot satisfy you.

"But Moses gained identity with the people of God. Maybe you think that wasn't worth much, but the world always thinks that.

"Moses also gained God's favor. The Devil probably often tempted him to doubt his wisdom, but when God needed a man to lead out his people he called up this man whom he could trust.

"He also gained eternal life. He has been thousands of years with God. He looked to eternity for his reward. You can choose the pleasures of this life or the joys of eternity, as you will. "Some of you people are going to

make your final choice, for eternity in this meeting. Let me remind you of a few things:

"The pleasures of sin are only for a season.

"There is danger of your being cut off in your sins.

"There is great danger of hardening your heart. These truths will not always touch your heart as they do now. You can now become a Christian if you will. If you go on resisting, the time will come when you could not if you would.

Lowryisms.

"The chief ambition of some of our girls is to be a 'society belle' and it takes only a little brass and a tongue to make a bell."

Of Interest to Farmers.

The last issue of the Scientific American has the following to say relative to John I. Weber's new patent draper:

DRAPER CANVAS.—J. I. Weber, 106 Van Buren avenue, Moscow, Idaho, The engraving illustrating this invention shows a plan view of the improvement. In the use of the ordinary draper, straw or grain stalks are very liable to become caught between transverse slats and the canvas, thus choking the elevator and increasing the draft. There is great liability of breakage, and the machine must be stopped until the straw can be pulled out. In the present canvas invention the inventor provides a draper canvas for use in harvesting machines for conveying the cut grain, especially designed to prevent any catching of the stalks in the draper, with a consequent increase of draft and liability to breakage.
