DISAGREES WITH PASTOR RUSSELL ON SOME POINTS

Editor Capital Journal: I have read with interest a sermon published in your paper by Pastor Russell, of Brooklyn, N. Y., on the text, "This day shalt thou be with me in Paradise," (Luke 23; 43.) Having myself made a careful study of this text from the original Greek, and having preached from it several times, permit me to say that Pastor Russell is in error in a number of assertions, to which I respectfully call your attention.

First, he has confused the word "Paradise" with that of "Hades." The Old Testament word "Sheol" does mean the grave, and correlates with the New Testament word "Hades" as used in Luke 16:23 and other passages, translated in the King James version as "Hell." On the other hand, the New Testament word "Paradise" correlates with the Old Testament word "Eden," and not with "Sheol." Both "Paradise" and "Eden" have the same meaning, "a park." The word "Paradise" is found three times in the New Testament. In 2 Cor. 12:4 it is impossible that it means anything but an exalted state of spiritual consciousness. In Rev. 2: 7, John the evangelist looks back to the first Eden which God made for man, a park with beautiful water, trees, and pleasant associa-

tions, and declares in matchless diction that God has prepared a new Eden, Paradise, or park, in which is the fountain of the water of life, and the tree of life that brings forth its fruits in its season. There can be no doubt but that the New Paradise is the Old Eden regained in a truer and better sense.

Secondly, Pastor Russell with some others has tried to change the punctuation of the passage to suit his needs. The fact is, "today" belongs with the text, "thou shalt be with me in Paradise." An examination of the Greek passages in which such a passage occurs will reveal two facts, one, the adverbial modifier "sermon" (today) almost always precedes that which it modifies, e. g., Matt 21; 28 reads in the original Greek, "Go today work in my vineyard," and two, in the seventy-three places where Jesus is recorded as saying, "Verily I say unto you," this is the only place where the word "today" immediately follows, so that it is the height of improbability to say that on this occasion He should have added such a redundant word. Hence the word belongs with that which follows.

Thirdly, Pastor Russell says that it is absurd to think that a man can be saved and go to heaven from his death-bed. According to scripture and reason, it is absurd if he cannot. In the parable of the laborers, Matt. 20; 1-14, Jesus teaches that the length of service does not count, but the condition of the heart. We are to be rewarded not according to the amount of work we have done, but the character of the work we have done. Any other system would be unjust. Again, in the familiar story of the prodigal son, the Father is represented as receiving, forgiving, and immediately restoring to full blessing, his wayward son. Jesus taught His disciples to pray, "Our Father," He did not teach them that God is like a father, but that He is a Father, and therefore He will do what any real father would do if he knew his son were as repentant as not to sin any more. He will forgive without punishment.

Fourthly, Pastor Russell is afraid that to admit a death-bed repentance being possible would cause many to put it off till then. But Christian ministers everywhere constantly warn individuals against putting off the matter of reconciliation with their Heavenly Father and showing that the thief that repented upon the cross repented at probably his very first opportunity, rather than at his eleventh hour. Genuine death-bed repentances are few indeed.

If God is a God of mercy and love, He will not punish one whose heart is right toward Him, because such a one is pleasing God and doing His will. To say that such one must make amends for his past sins, which God has promised to remove as "far as the east is from the west," is to revive the old

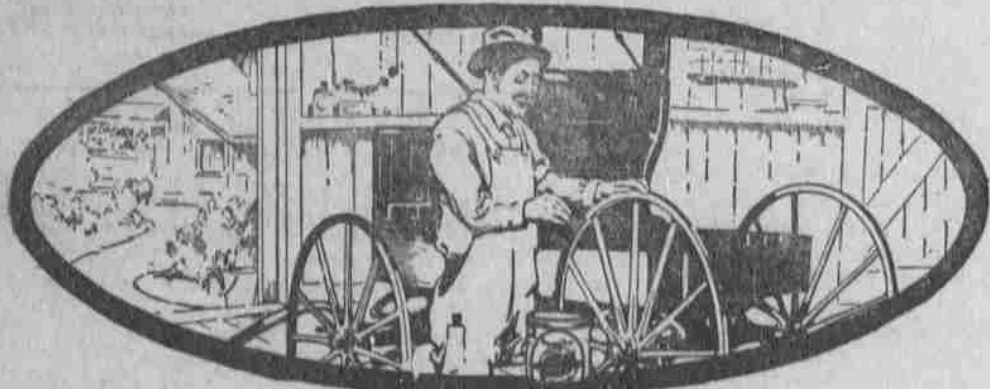

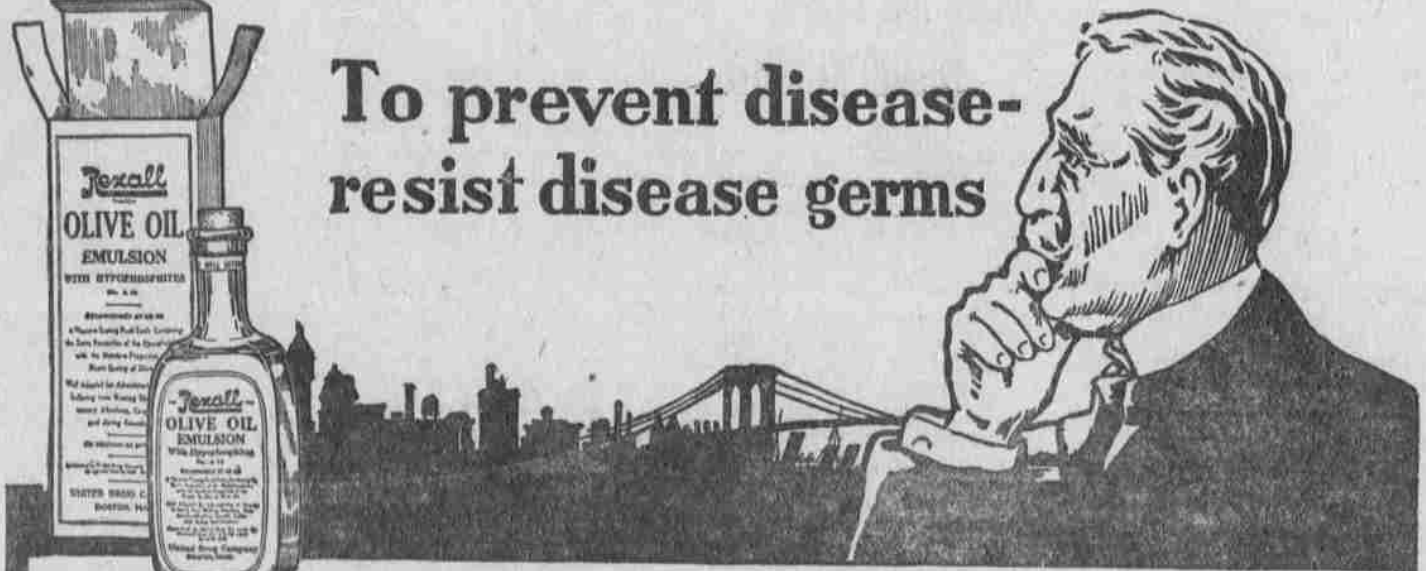
