## FAITH OR WORKS; WHICH SAVES US

God Developing Most Wonderful Creation in Universe.

A Question Long in Dispute is Now Clear Through a Better Understanding of Bible—"The Path of the Just is as the Shining Light, Shining More and More Unto the Perfect Day."



PASTOR RUSSELL

London, August 4.—London Tabernacle was crowded, as usual, twice today to hear Pastor Russell. We report one of his discourses from the text, "Not of works, lest any man should boast; for we are His workmanship."—Ephesians ii, 9, 10.

If the Bible taught that salvation would be the reward of good works, it would harmonize better with the common conception. Why should God specially reward faith? Why should He not specially reward good works? The answer to this question can be appreciated only by an understanding of the future, as well as of the present, of the Divine Plan, said Pastor Russell. In God's general dealings with angels and with men, His principle is to reward works, obedience. God's exceptional dealings are with the Church—for special reasons, which we shall see.

During Messiah's glorious reign, for which we pray, "Thy Kingdom come," the world in general will not be on trial so much for faith, but rather for works—as we read, "They shall be judged, every man according to his works." This obedience to the laws and regulations of Messiah's Kingdom will be rewarded by gradual restitution to perfection. With every exercise of righteousness and obedience will come the reward of strength of mind and body.

### The Church Walks by Faith.

But how different matters are now! said Pastor Russell. Everything is dark, except as the eye of faith can see more or less obscurely in the light of God's promises and the types of the past. "So," said the Apostle, "we (the Church), walk by faith and not by sight." St. Peter declares that we should take heed to the word of prophecy as a light in a dark place while waiting for the dawning of the New Day (II Peter i, 19). We are very near to that New Day now, but we still need the light of the Lamp, the Word of God, and it is shining more clearly than ever before. It is showing us the explanation of our text, that the Church is not being judged or tested according to works, but according to her faith.

In the present time perfect works are impossible anyway, because of our imperfection through heredity from the fall, and because of the imperfection of all in contact with us in the affairs of life, and because of the evil influence of Satan and the fallen angels—"seducing spirits."—I Tim. iv, 1. It is when the believer reaches the point of a full consecration of himself to God that Jesus becomes his Advocate with the Father and imputes of His merit as a covering for the sinner's blemishes, and thus makes Him acceptable to the Father as a living sacrifice and footstep follower of the Master and prospective heir of God and joint-heir with Jesus Christ his Lord.

### We Are God's Workmanship.

However, as soon as the Father has accepted the sinner, as soon as he has been begotten of the Holy Spirit as a New Creature, old things are passed away, and thenceforth he may do works—must do works indeed. If he does not do works he will die spiritually. But the old creature, the sinner, can do no works to merit Divine approval. His faith in the Redeemer makes him acceptable. As a New Creature he has no sins to be forgiven. The New Creature has no heredity from the past, but may cry, "Abba, Father." As a son the New Creature is permitted to work and must be first his Father's business—must seek first the interests of the Divine Kingdom.

The Church Class is God's New Creation. In the remote past He created the thousands of millions of worlds, samples of which may be witnessed on a starry night. But with all their immensity they were as nothing to His new creation of angels in various orders, and later, the creation of man, of the earth earthy. Even the smallest insect is a greater creation than the creation of an inanimate world, because the insect has will, volition, soul, of its own. God having created all these other things, at last purposed the creation of a still higher order of beings than the angelic, who are soon to be "partakers of the divine nature."—II Peter i, 4.

For more than eighteen centuries God has been working on this New Creation. First of all, Jesus, the great Messianic Head, was made perfect through sufferings, prepared for this divine nature and received to it in His glorious resurrection. Since Pentecost God has been accepting by the begetting of the Holy Spirit such of humanity as avail themselves of the glorious privilege of this Age. Only those possessing faith can be of this class. To all others the invitation and glorious description of the heavenly nature are foolishness.

## VAULT TO HOLD TWO BILLIONS IN GOLD

### Sunken Storehouse for Cords of Yellow Bars Congress' Consent Asked.

Washington, July 27.—A steel-ribbed, five-story vault, sunk in the earth beneath the United States assay office, in New York, and capable of holding two billion dollars in gold, is planned by Secretary MacVough, of the Treasury Department. This project—the largest money vault in the world—requires the sanction of Congress, and has already received a favorable report from the House Committee on Appropriations. MacVough believes the vault is a necessity for the convenience and safety of the nation's wealth. Gold is purchased by the United States Government at the rate of \$100,000,000 a year. This treasure, against which gold certificates are issued, is distributed the country over in the vaults of the treasury, sub-treasuries, mints and assay offices. Within a few years, it is estimated, the entire storage capacity of these buildings will have been exhausted.

If authorized, the big vault will be erected under the proposed new front portion of the assay office. It will cost \$322,000, while the building standing over it will cost only \$25,000. Folded bullion, turned into bars, will be piled in the structure like bricks. While this storehouse could hold all the Government's gold at the present time, it is not the intention to mass it in New York, but to reserve the space for future hoardings.

## HOOKWORM CRUSADE IN KENTUCKY

Campaign is Started in Eastern Part of the State.

Barbourville, Ky., July 28.—The Rockefeller Sanitary Commission, the Kentucky Board of Health, with the cooperation of the Knox County Medical Society and the county officials, have launched the first hookworm crusade in the State in this county, and during the past week a corps of trained microscopists have been making tests in various parts of the county.

The State health authorities have decided to eradicate the hookworm parasite in Kentucky, and all the efforts of the State Board, assisted by the Rockefeller endowment for that purpose will be bent toward accomplishing this end.

The war in Knox County is but the start of a wholesale campaign which will be carried to every county in Kentucky similarly affected. The medical experts under the direction of Dr. J. N. McCormack and Dr. J. S. Lock, have visited half a dozen towns in Knox County during the past week and have examined several hundred patients. In every instance where treatment was given a cure was effected, and the physicians are confident of wiping out the disease in Knox County within the next six weeks.

Following the six weeks' war on the parasite in Knox County the fight will be taken to other counties. Bell County, where the infection is large, will be visited next.
