

REPUBLICANS REVOLTING AT ASSEMBLY DOMINATION

Uncompromising Fight On the Machine, Which Is Parading Its Republicanism Only to Gain Power and Plunder the Taxpayers--Frame Up of Big Interests Back of the Assembly Program.

"Ed. Journal: We hear a good deal about the Assembly. I have been a Republican all my life but I look upon the Assembly as nothing but a machine move. If the Assembly had put up the names of three men as candidates for Governor and three names for secretary of state and so on for all the positions to be filled, the voters might have had some confidence in them. It does not take a very shrewd observer to see that it is a movement started by just a few and that it is not representative. I think it the duty of every voter in Oregon who loves representative government and who is against Machine politics and graft to do his utmost to defeat the Assembly ticket."

The writer of the above then proceeds to give details of abuses practiced at one of the state institutions. He cites facts of political managers violating the proprieties of the State, improper use of state funds, exceeding the authority of the legislature, and financially favoring certain individuals. These are matters that ought to be investigated and will be if I am elected Governor. I do not think it is proper to go into them in a primary campaign, and I will not do so. But I will add that because it is known I do not endorse these practices and would not permit them.

I am fought by the Machine as not being a good Republican. I will not defend my Republicanism. I have supported for office and helped elect every man who is now attacking me and I leave to their own consciences or sense of humor the justification of their conduct. So far as they represent devotion to the Machine I have no compromise with them. They worship the Machine more than Republican principles. Many of these gentlemen when I was supporting the entire Republican ticket two years ago, including the whole legislative ticket, were knifing three men on the Representative ticket and supporting George M. Chamberlain for United States Senator. I was supporting all the Republican nominees including Mr. C. C. Baker for U. S. Senator. Who are the loyal Republicans by the record? I or they?

Am I a Good Republican?
They began to attack my Republicanism away back in the days of Governor Penoyer. I sympathized with his fight to exclude Chinese coolies from the United States, and to make the grafting receivership that was robbing the old Yaquina Bay Railroad pay its laborers. I helped him cut off two professional grafts at a state institution, where

two Salem politicians were getting \$2,500 a year as sinecures for political services. Those two professionals have never thought well of me since and I was never a good Republican in their eyes. They were getting rich off their devotion to the grand old party and that political aristocracy of the graft has never ceased to circulate the report that I was not a good Republican. I will stand for any amount of honest expenditures and employment of labor but will not stand for a dollar of political graft.

Anti-Graft in County.
I made the same fight against grafts in our county government. When certain contractors and county officials were running enormous bills for repairs at the court house and charged \$5.00 apiece for sawing two inches off the legs of courthouse tables, I exposed them in The Capital Journal and the grand jury investigations proved the truth of what I said and that crowd denounced me as not being a good Republican. Show me a professional graft politician whose plans have been interfered with in the slightest and I will show you a man who doubts the wisdom of making me governor of Oregon and who will tell you on the quiet that I am not a good Republican. What does their Republicanism consist of? Does it stand on the Simon-pure principles of honesty and devotion to common people, whom Abraham Lincoln loved, or does it consist of the near-criminal desire to get their hands into the treasury?

Machine Wants Grafts.
The Machine complains about the expense of Direct Primary election. It howls about the cost of the Initiative and Referendum. But the whole program of the Machine is to create new grafts. It wants to create the office of Lieutenant Governor. It wants to hold a constitutional convention that would cost \$250,000 and make new places for machine politicians. It wants a State Board of control to buy all state supplies at wholesale from the Packing House Trust, from the Sugar Trust and the Standard Oil company, from the Lumber Trust and put the Machine in direct contact with the big interests. No Machine candidate is in favor of convict labor on the highways because it would interfere with the enormous profits of Prison Contract labor. The Machine can only exist by making new places for its adherents and that is the real course and backbone of the Assembly program. The frame-up of the Big Interests in the last Oregon State Senate is to become the government of Oregon.

SINCE the days of Henry Ward Beecher and Dr. Talmage no preacher has occupied so prominent a position in the United States of America as Pastor Russell of Brooklyn Tabernacle holds today. Now we on this side of the Atlantic are to be privileged to listen to the man the announcement of whose name fills to overflowing the largest halls in the United States.

Pastor Russell will be the principal speaker at the meetings of the International Bible Students' association's meetings, which are to be held at the Albert hall on the evening of Sunday next and the two following Sundays. He will in addition visit during the next three weeks the principal cities and towns in England, Scotland and Ireland.

Like Beecher and Talmage, both of the same City of Churches, Pastor Russell is an independent teacher, not allied to any particular denomination, and his great powers of oratory to the molding of public thought "with malice toward none, with charity for all." Above all, the pastor may be described as strictly orthodox.

Although Pastor Russell holds to the Bible tenaciously, he claims to have proved that on some points it has been misunderstood by both friends and foes. In his search for a basis upon which to build his hope for future bliss he undertook a lengthy investigation of the claims of Confucius, Mohammed, Buddha and other founders of religion. These he found to be unsatisfactory to either heart or head. Almost without hope, he took up the systematic study of the question of the punishment for sin. His findings were such as to restore perfect confidence in the Bible as God's inspired word and revelation.

Over 600 leading American newspapers now publish Pastor Russell's sermons weekly, reaching approximately 10,000,000 homes. He is also author of works entitled "Studies in the Scriptures," over 5,000,000 volumes being in the hands of readers. The sixth million is now in the press. This is a remarkable testimony to the popularity of his writings. Pastor Russell is now on his way to London, having just revisited the pyramids and Palestine. It is expected that his recent investigations will have much to do in still further unsealing the mysteries which for centuries have been kept secret by that "Stone Witness." The Great Pyramid is the subject of an important chapter in one of his books, in which he makes some most interesting applications of the published measurements made by the late Piazzi Smyth, formerly astronomer royal for Scotland. Dr. John Edgar within the last year has verified all of Professor Smyth's measurements, which have been used by Mr. Russell. The return of the Jews to their promised land, as prophesied in the Scriptures, has been elaborately treated by Mr. Russell, and he will now be in position to speak with added knowledge regarding the work of the Zionists.
