Lawyer Proposes Another Religion. Chicagoan Outlines Moral Platform for all Races and Creeds. CHICAGO, April 22.—Attorney Quin O'Brien, in an address on "Our Twentieth Century Heritage," before the Illinois State court, Catholic Order of Foresters, outlined a universal religion, which he designated as a sort of moral platform upon which all could stand, whether Jew or Gentile, Protestant or Catholic, following are the planks he suggests for that platform: The Golden Rule. The Lord's Prayer. The Ten Commandments. The sermon on the Mount. The separation of the church and state. Respect womanhood and keep it pure. Uplift manhood and keep it honest. Charity for the weak and justice for all. Sacredness of marriage and diminution of divorce. Equal rights, political, legal, and religious, to all, and special favors and unjust favors to none. Co-operation and arbitration between labor and capital and more equal distribution of their profits. Respect for established laws and endeavor to simplify and improve them. Promotion of temperance and prevention of crime. Broader and better education, not only of the head but of the heart and conscience as well. Development of public spirit and decrease of party and factional spirit. Opposition to war and elimination of racial and national prejudice. Malice toward none, charity for all and firmness in the right as God gives us to see the right. Co-operation of all to promote the good and great things we have in common.
