NO ROOM IN HIS MIND FOR HELL

NOTED BROOKLYN DIVINE, REV. CHARLES T. RUSSELL, ATTACKS IDEA OF BEING A HELL AS ABSURD--SAYS GOD WOULD NO MORE TORTURE US THAN A HUMAN BEING WOULD.

That Calvin and Luther invented hell as it is accepted today to take the place of purgatory, as believed in by Catholics, was one of the statements made by Rev. Charles T. Russell, of Brooklyn and London tabernacles, who spoke in Portland to 1200 persons last night.

Pastor Russell arrived in Portland from Sacramento yesterday morning and will remain until after tonight's meeting. He will answer questions tonight, and has announced no subject.

From here the evangelist will go to Tacoma and Seattle and Vancouver, B. C. Thence he will visit Calgary, Winnipeg and Toronto, Canada. He has visited the principle cities of the United States on his way West.

The preacher is traveling under the auspices of the International Bible Students, who bear his expenses. No collection was taken at last night's service.

Resurrection Is Belief.

He believes in a gradual resurrection from the dead for all the wicked and an instantaneous resurrection for the righteous. He explained that he believes in the second appearing of Christ.

"God is now fitting his church to save the world," he said. "He has not yet begun to save the world at large, but he will do that after saving the elect. Gradually, every man, in his own order, all that are in their graves, will come forth."

Rev. Russell was formerly a Congregational minister. "But I found I did not believe all the doctrines of the church," he said, "and I threw away my Bible, becoming one of the higher critics, as we call them. I supposed then that the creeds fairly represented the Bible. But I came later to see differently."

Hell Belief Saddening.

"I think I could come very near picking out the Catholics in this congregation tonight by their countenances. There is something about the face of a Catholic that indicates pain and fear. The trouble is that the Catholic expects to go to purgatory. My dear Catholic brother, if I believed as you do, my face would be very sad. The reason the average Protestant does not have a more sorrowful face is not because he has a better theology, but because he does not believe the theology he does have, while Catholics believe theirs."

"I am not here to say an unkind word against any Catholic, or anyone else. I want to tell you, however, why I am not a Catholic. I was born of Protestant parents, and probably that had a great deal to do with the matter. But since I have come to think I have never believed in purgatory."

As I look at your faces I say to myself, 'These are all sinful human beings. The Bible says 'there is not one righteous, no nor one.' Yet with all your imperfections not one here would be willing to persecute a fellow creature for 24 hours. If I have such a good idea of human nature what conception must I have of our Creator who gave good gifts to all mankind? Will he do worse by us than we would do by the brute creation?"

Doctrine Called Devilish.

"I have spoken of the Catholics, but the truth is the Protestants have the most devilish doctrine regarding the hereafter there is on earth. No heathen holds as wicked a doctrine upon this point as the average Protestant. We all regret that Calvin sent his Christian brothers to the stake, but whoever copies a wicked god will be a wicked man."

"Centuries before Luther's time our Catholic friends had said, 'We have an apostolic succession. Why have we go back to the Apostles should we go back to the Apostles James and John and Paul for our religion when we have living teachers?' So they taught men how to believe, and for a long time thereafter the word of God was very little studied."

"Luther said to himself: 'It seems to me our church has departed from much of its simplicity.' So he wrote the Pope, 'Would it not be wise to call a council of the church, to find whether the Catholic church has departed in large degree from the teachings of the Bible.' But the Pope put him out as a heretic, and he was no longer able to preach in the church. Then he sent out tracts, and a number of other said, 'We believe as you do, it is time to protest

against the teachings of our church. They were called Protestants. Luther's Action Cited.

"They declared purgatory a creature of the imagination. But people said, 'What about the millions of people whom we have been praying out of purgatory? You haven't made provisions for them.'"

"Luther and his associates could find no room in heaven for them, so they said, 'As our forefathers made purgatory out of the imagination we will make hell, and plunge all these beings in there, patting the sign large, 'Who enters here abandons hope.'"

"About that time Brother Calvin came along, and said, 'Brethren, you look very blue.' 'Yes,' they replied, 'we used to tell the people their friends could be prayed out of purgatory, but now we have nothing to tell them but that their friends are roasting through all eternity, and will never get out at all.'"

"Calvin said, 'You would like to get out of it, would you? Well, say God did it long before you were born that you couldn't help it. You'll either have to shift the blame on God or else bear it yourselves.' They told Calvin to write it all out, and he did. Most preachers have his books nowadays."

Wisely Preaches Change.

"As the Congregationalists, Presbyterians and Baptists were organized, they said, 'Put Calvin at the bottom of the structure,' and so it was."

"After another few years came another poor John. He was John Wesley. He said, 'I can't preach that, for the Bible says, 'God is love.' The ring of his hammer went all around the world, until most of them who have Calvin at the bottom of their creed have Wesley at the top of their head."

"Wesley said all the saints go to heaven, as Calvin said, and that all the others go to hell."

"But God has two salvations. The Bible tells of the salvation of the church, which is before the world's salvation. God hasn't begun the world's salvation yet; he is only getting ready for it by gathering the church class up."

TO EXAMINE IRRIGATION PROJECTS

The members of the state desert land board and also the state board will begin their tour of inspection of the irrigation projects under way in the state on July 4, and will be absent from the capital city for a period of approximately four weeks.

The first stop will be made at Klamath Falls where they will view a project under way and then they will proceed to Lakeview where they will look over the Warner Valley project consisting of 130,000 acres. From there they will journey to Paisley where there is located a project of 12,000 acres.

The irrigation project at Lapine will be the next investigated. It contains some 31,000 acres. Bend will be the next town visited and from there the journey will be homeward.

The members of the board who will make the inspection tour are Governor West, Secretary of State Olcott, State Treasurer Kay, Attorney General Crawford and State Engineer Lewis. It is probable that James R. Linn, member of the parole board, will accompany them.

HE TEMPERED JUSTICE WITH LOTS OF MERCY

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE] New York, June 30.—Jos. Reichman, former president of the Carnegie Trust company, who was convicted Monday of having made false reports to the banking department, was sentenced today by Justice Davis to serve four and a half months in the penitentiary.

Justice Davis in pronouncing sentence, said he did not consider that Reichman had acted with criminal intent but that the practice of bank officers making false returns must stop.

Reichman at once applied to Justice Erlanger for a certificate of reasonable doubt pending an appeal from the conviction, and the matter was taken under advisement.

GOVERNMENT ATTACKS THE LITTLE ONES

New York, June 30.—The legality of indictments returned by a grand jury here against the heads of the United States steel corporation, will be attacked and the demurrers to the indictments will be filed soon.

United States District Attorney Wise today declared that despite the fact that most of the steel pools quit business two years ago, captured correspondence shows that the wire concerns conducted business since that time along the same lines as the pool promoters had planned.

The government action in attacking the subsidiaries of the steel trust first is believed to be only preliminary to a general assault on the parent combination in the near future.
