## PASTOR RUSSELL ACCEPTS CALL HERE

### Head of Brooklyn and London Tabernacles Comes to Washington Temple Congregation.

Pastor Charles T. Russell, of the Brooklyn and London Tabernacles, is to serve as pastor of the newlyformed non-sectarian Washington Temple Congregation, according to an announcement made at the meeting of that organization in New Masonic Temple yesterday afternoon, when Evangelist G. H. Raymond, of New York, spoke on "Divine Secrets." In his letter to the congregation, which was received on Saturday by the business committee of the organization, which consists of Brig. Gen. William P. Hall, formerly military secretary of the War Department; J. D. Pyles, and Eliot Thomson, Pastor Russell says he can only give a portion of the year to the work here, reserving the other to the work in London and Brooklyn. He will preach the first sermon of his pastorate here on the first Sunday in January.

Other sermons will be preached by him on the second and third Sundays of the same month, and for the subjects he has chosen the three inscriptions on the new Union Station: "Thou Hast Put All Things Under Him"; "The Desert Shall Rejoice and Blossom as the Rose," and "The Truth Shall Make You Free." "The advantage of your city as a whole," wrote Pastor Russell, "I fully appreciate. It must be that the pulse-beat of this whole nation along lines of religion, education, and art, as well as in finance and politics, find their heart-center in the Capital of what you justly term the greatest nation on earth. The more I think over the matter and pray respecting it, the more am I pleased to accept the call."

### EGGS ARRIVE SAFELY.

Package Reaches Here After Journey of 2,500 Miles in Mails.

Proof that eggs can be safely shipped through the parcel post was made by the delivery of one dozen eggs at the Washington Post-office which were shipped from Oklahoma City, 2,500 miles away. The eggs, which arrived yesterday, were shipped in a carton invented by J. M. Shelton, of Oklahoma City, and were unbroken, though the package had been marked only "merchandise" and had been treated like other fourth-class matter.

The present postal regulations prohibit the shipment of eggs through the mails, but they will be admitted to the parcel post. The shipment from Oklahoma was made with the knowledge of the Post-office Department officials as a test.
