RULE OF MAN IS HEARING'S END

"Pastor" Russell Says Great European War Is Fulfilling Bible Prediction.

"When our good president called upon the nation to observe one Sunday as peace Sunday, I could not join with him. This great war was ordained long ago. It is the doing of God, and will listen to our prayers now and change these long laid plans; especially when we cannot always settle our own little quarrels."

This is "Pastor" Russell's opinion of the European war, as expressed Monday night in his sermon at the completely filled El Paso theater. As he delivered his sermon, "Pastor" Russell, a man of 62 years, paced up and down the stage, often gesturing to emphasize his points. His white hair and beard, contrasting with a long frock coat of somber black, made him a striking figure.

"This conflict," he said, "can be contrasted with Armageddon. As I take it, it will first mean a weakening of the body of mankind, then will follow a great revolt, then anarchy and, out of this, the fulfillment of the kingdom. It was prophesied that all the nations should meet on a great battlefield and so, at this time, we seem to see it."

"As to its cause, it is a world-wide scramble for commercial supremacy. I see no reason why, under any circumstances, we should be drawn into it. I trust that our worthy president will have the whole-hearted support of every citizen at this time."

Why God Favors War. "But how is it," "Pastor" Russell, that God will favor war? you ask. "Why doesn't he destroy us with disease, tornado, flood, flame?"

"The answer to one is the answer to the other. Sin in the answer. Because each of us is born deformed, physically, morally, because we have all inherited the original sin, and the sentence that God prescribed was death."

Time after time, to emphasize his points, "Pastor" Russell asked himself, "Why, as a Christian, at this time, are we coming from the audience in propounded questions to the audience which he himself has asked at various times the audience stilled with him but, with a few words or a gesture, he would bring home his point, the audience again serious and listening to his every word."

Misconception of Hell. The greater part of his sermon was devoted to the hell as it has been generally thought of and the hell that he believes the Bible conceives. "Hell is the tomb," he said, "it is written that every man shall die. But he shall be resurrected. Since we were children we have been taught of the hell steaming and boiling, of the devil with seven hoods and spiked tails. All this is foreign to the Bible. There are creeds, creeds, creeds and each creed reads into the Bible its own meaning, its own interpretation, and to its followers all other meanings are wrong and lead to damnation. But there is one Bible and its teachings, to the mind not hampered with distorted creeds, is clear. The hell of creeds has been used to frighten the world into goodness. Well, it has been frightening the world for a good many years, and the result—the increase in goodness—is fittingly shown at this time when half the world is killing."
