RACE TRACK SUITS AGAINST CRUCE MONDAY

Oklahoma City, Okla., May 29.—Attorney General S. P. Freeling announced today that he personally will represent the attorney general's office in defending ex-Governor Leo Cruce, Adjutant General Frank at Canton and Major Winfield Scott in the \$25,000 damage suit brought against them by R. P. Allison, president of the Tulsa Jockey club, scheduled to come up for trial in the district court here next Monday.

The attorney general directed a letter to the former governor informing him that he will take pleasure in giving his service to Cruce and the various guard officers sued by Allison. Judge D. Richardson of the law firm of Ames, Chambers, Love & Richardson also will appear in the defense of the case, Allison brought suit against Governor Cruce, General Canton and Major Scott in the district court about one year ago, assessing \$25,000 damages because a running race meet scheduled at Tulsa had been stopped by the state militia, acting under direct order of the governor.

LILLIE WHITE, SHE IS SAID TO BE NEGRO

AFTER YEARS OF EFFORT MRS. LITTLE GIVES UP FUTILE FIGHT

With light hair, gray eyes and fair complexion, Mrs. Little has sought vainly to prove she has no negro blood. The case has excited race fanatics and attracted the attention of the whole country.

Mrs. Little married Arthur Little, a Quakerist there, son of Dr. John S. Little, in 1874. He died for illness in 1885, leaving her a widow with a wife in an orphanage. She has affidavits from Mrs. P. Jefferson, formerly Mrs. Wade, a quadroon, and matron in a railroad station in Cincinnati, and former member of her party, that Mrs. Little is Mrs. Wade's daughter and that her father was Thomas Wade, a full-blooded negro.

Mrs. Little says her parents were of pure white blood, Massachusetts, and descendants of Daniel Boone. Dying when she was very young, they left a considerable amount of money to her. Mrs. Wade, enjoining her to care for their small daughter, Mrs. Little says she says frankly she did not tell her husband of her early environment, lest he get the idea she bore some relationship to her foster-mother.

Mrs. Little in her many futile efforts to prove that negro blood does not taint here has consulted several scientists. One, Dr. Victor C. Vaughan, dean of the medical department of the university of Michigan, Prof. Vaughan told Mrs. Little that to all outward appearances she is white, but that he could not make an affidavit to such a statement.

BOOZE CAUSE OF AN EAST SIDE TRAGEDY

DAVIS BROTHERS KILL POLICEMAN WHO BEFRIENDED THEM

Cincinnati, Ohio, May 29.—L. C. Wolfenberger, night policeman at Collierville, was stabbed to death by Joe and John D. Davis, brothers. The attack occurred while Wolfenberger was escorting the men, who were in an intoxicated condition, to their home. According to the Collierville marshal, the Davis brothers had been drinking and were creating a disturbance in the business section. Some one called the police and Wolfenberger was sent on the call. Instead of taking them to the jail he sought to perform an act of kindness and take them home. When they were near the Davis home one of the men turned and struck the officer and the other attacked him with a knife. His leg was severed and he received numerous wounds about the body.

Wolfenberger's cries for help were heard and several men rushed to the scene from their homes. They were too late to give assistance to Wolfenberger, but grappled with the assailants and took the knife which they had. They were taken to the Collierville jail.

Friday public sentiment had become aroused to such a pitch in Collierville that the Davis brothers were spirited away in a motor car. Mob violence was feared. They were then taken to Tulsa where they were placed in the city jail to await removal to the county jail at Claremore.

BRITAIN IS UNDER CLOUD BERLIN SAYS

FRENCH ANGRY OVER FAILURE BRITISH NAVY'S OFFENSIVE; DISTRUST

(By T. C. Wheeler.)

Caracas, Venezuela, May 29.—For Juan Cardenas, the French correspondent of the Nuevo Diario, in a recent dispatch discusses the sentiment of the soldiers in the French trenches. He says that it was in the title of his last first the French felt convinced that the English had deceived them. There the men are within earshot of the German soldiers and constantly in touch with them.

The men in the trenches spread that conviction to the civilian population of France. He relates the following incidents:

British Purposes Unmasked. "It is certainly not the case that the English deceive the French. Britishers never deceive, but look out for their own advantage. They have not masked their intentions and do not take the trouble to be political hypocrites. They endeavor to crush a power which has risen against their world power. They have incited nation against nation, so that they may all be equally embroiled.

"France certainly did not expect that from her allies. France confidently believed that the first act of the British squadrons, after the declaration of war, would be the bombardment of the German coasts. Many months have passed now, but English ships have paid no visits to Hamburg, Bremen or Kiel. Herr Balke, the general manager of the Hamburg American line, was right in saying that the powerful British navy is crushed. What good are squadrons if they cannot attack the enemy on his own coasts?"

Much Disappointment Keen

"The French experienced that first disappointment recently, but kept quiet. The English endeavored to hunt down small German ships like the Emden, the Naueberg and the Dresden, which were raiding commerce on the open sea. To attain that end numerous British ships were brought into action.

"Moreover, the English neglected to send reinforcements to France in time. And there is no remedy. If the war stops tomorrow the English have done a good stroke of business. France is bruised and worn out; Belgium is devastated; Russia is defeated. All the belligerents are entangled except England, which has a splendid future before her. She has retained her power, her trade is intact, and until the other powers have recovered and their industries have revived England alone will supply the whole world. What price did the English pay? Some billions of dollars, which can be put to the debt of future purchasers.

Financial Costs Enormous. "The present war is different from that of 1870. It affects all nations, and they cannot help each other. Where is Russia to get the money? In France nobody will help her. Russia is a 'dear' which has cost her French lover \$25,000,000 so far!

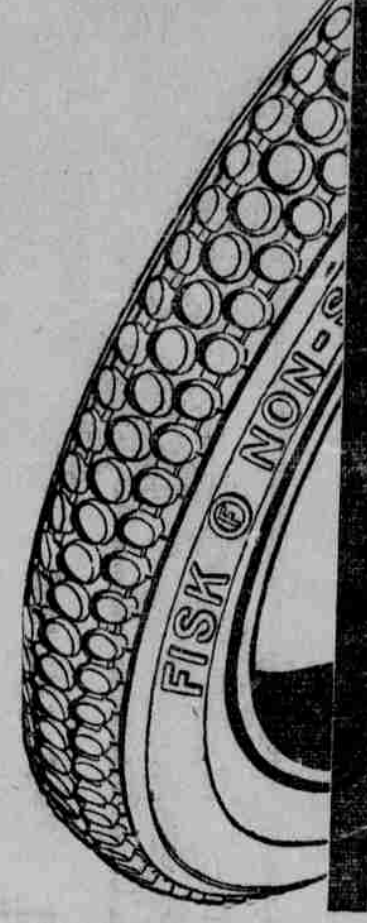
"It is impossible to predict the result of the war now. But one thing is certain—the allies will fall out. What happened at the end of the Balkan war will recur in a larger measure. Then Bulgaria wanted to pluck the fruit of victory, and her allies turned against her. After this war England's friends and foe will confidently hate and fight her. That is inevitable.

French Resources Exhausted. "The English papers write that the war will last long and that the final triumph depends on its length. But France has used up her reserves, has the class of 1915 in the field and is calling that of 1916 to arms.

"Since Aug. 4 the French government has spent billions of francs without the sanction of parliament. Now the chambers are convoked to grant another six billions, likewise 'without control.' Therefore the war costs France 1,900,000,000 francs every month, apart from government expenses. And French territory is still occupied by the enemy.

"But the English retort: 'You must resist. The war is going to last long.' 'It was a fine day yesterday, a splendid day!' said a wounded zouave-

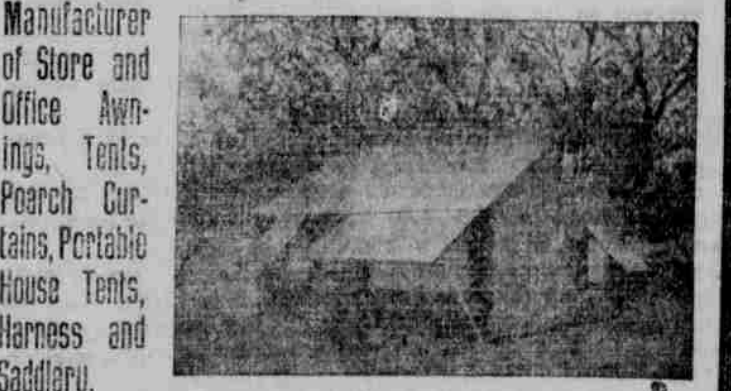
