

# POLICE CAN'T GET PROWLERS

Places About City Continue to Report Men Sneaking About Homes and Trying to Enter.

## AT HOLDSWORTHS AGAIN

Old Hubinger Home on Avenue Sent in an Alarm Last Night, But No One But Lovers Found There.

Julius Holdsworth, who with his family lives at the old Hubinger place, 1219 Grand avenue, was again disturbed by some one prowling about the place last night. The police were called and an officer investigating found no one about the grounds but a young fellow and girl sitting by the old lake bed.

Mr. Holdsworth states that he heard and saw some one walking about on the front porch of the residence about half past eight or a quarter of nine. He has become so used to having persons prowling about the place lately, that he has determined to keep the police busy helping him to keep out intruders. The police have been unable to discover who the parties were about the Hubinger place a week ago.

More Prowlers Reported. Almost every night word is sent to the police station of some one skulking suspiciously about on porches and in yards but as yet the police have been unable to get their hands on any one who might be trying to break and enter the places reported.

It was reported that a burglar alarm came from Eighth and Orleans street on Saturday night but the officers have heard nothing of the matter.

The John D. Sheehan home at 913 Bank street on Thursday night of last week, was the latest place of burglar disturbance, with the exception of the Holdsworth scare last night.

**ALL READY FOR BIG OPENING**

Lunch Will be Served at Camp Eleven on the Elks Tomorrow Evening After the Ball Game.

Committee and Assistants Have Everything in Readiness and Wiring Was Done Today.

The handiest and most comfortable camp that has ever been arranged by the Elks for their annual outing, has been about completed at the Dickinson farm on the other side of the river between Hamilton and Warsaw. Tomorrow evening after the ball game will be the first christening of the seventh annual Camp Eleven, when a lunch will be served at the Elk resort at supper time.

Today the premises were cleaned and all bits of out-of-place rubbish and dried grass and weeds were burned. The opening of Camp Eleven will be held on next Saturday. Ladies' days will be Thursdays of each week.

# SOLDIERS REUNION AUGUST 10TH

Fiftieth Anniversary of the Battle of Wilson's Creek to be Observed in Keokuk Next Month.

## FIRST IOWA INFANTRY

Circulars Have Been Sent Out to all Survivors, Asking Them to Meet in This City for Reunion.

Keokuk expects to entertain many veterans of the Civil war next year, which will be the golden anniversary of the mobilizing of Iowa troops in this city at the beginning of the Civil war.

There will be one reunion this year, the fiftieth anniversary of the battle of Wilson's Creek to be celebrated here on August 10 by the survivors of the First Iowa Infantry.

The officers of the annual reunion have issued the following notice to the old members:

Attention First Iowa Infantry. Fiftieth Anniversary of the Battle of Wilson's Creek, August 10, 1861, at Keokuk. Comrades:— As you are aware, this is the fiftieth anniversary of the greatest event in the history of the First Iowa, and an event that made Iowa famous throughout the North, and, as said grand old War Governor Kirkwood: "Before the battle of Wilson's Creek, an Iowa had no honors in Washington, but when the report of that battle reached Washington it was an honor to be an Iowan."

Comrades, let us that have survived to this fiftieth anniversary get together and make it the memorial event in our biennial reunions as it may be the last time we shall meet as an organization.

# TWO GREAT BABYLONS AND TWO GREAT CAPTIVITIES

Pastor Russell Sees Type and Anti-type as Between Babylon of Old and "Mystic Babylon," and Between the Captivity of Fleshly Israel and the Captivity of Spiritual Israel.



Seattle, Wash., July 2.—Bible Students and the public in great numbers heard Pastor Russell here today.

We report one of his discourses on the "Two Babylons"—one Literal and the other Mystical. He said in part:— For centuries Bible Students have observed that many of the strong expressions of the Old Testament respecting Babylon found their parallels in the New Testament, used in respect to Mystic Babylon.

Great Babylon of Old. Briefly we remind you that ancient Babylon was built on the river Euphrates, that she had impregnable walls, that the river ran through the midst of the city and the great gates of brass spanned the river as a protection against assaults of an enemy from that quarter.

We remind you of the captivity first of the ten tribes of Israel, and later on of the remaining two tribes or kingdom called Judah. Cyrus, the Persian King, gained his victory in a remarkable manner, while the Babylonians, assured of their security, were reveling at a banquet. Cyrus had dug a canal of considerable depth ready to drain off the water of the river as soon as the necessary connection was made.

When the canal water flowed into the new channel, it left the bed of the river under the great brazen gates, on both sides of the city, an open roadway, through which marched the army of Cyrus. Suddenly, at an unexpected moment, the boastful city, the proud Babylon, was captured.

Antitypical or Mystic Babylon. While speaking directly of Babylon and her fall at the hands of the Medes and Persians under Cyrus, the prophecies speak of the end of this Age and of world-wide calamities incidental to the overthrow of every institution contrary to the Divine will, preparatory to the inauguration of Messiah's Kingdom.

I request that at your convenience you read Isaiah xlii, 1-49, in confirmation of what I have said. I recommend further that you compare Jeremiah 1, 15, 29, 57th Revelation xviii, 6; and the 28th verse with Revelation xvi, 12, and the 40th verse with Revelation xviii, 9. Compare also Jeremiah 49, 6-9, with Revelation xviii, 4; and verse 13 with Revelation xvii, 15, 16; and verses 37, 63, 64 with Revelation xviii, 2, 4, 21.

As Literal Babylon ruled over the whole world so Mystic Babylon is represented as ruling the civilized world, and hence the entire world. As the lords of Babylon were made drunk by wine which they drank from the golden vessels captured from the temple at Jerusalem, so Mystic Babylon, represented by a woman, is said to make all nations drunk with the wine or doctrine which she gives them out of the golden cup which she holds in her hand. As Literal Babylon fell by the drying up of the waters of the Euphrates, and that the way of the kings of the East shall be prepared by the drying up of those waters (Revelation xvi, 12).

Similarly, we are assured, Mystic Babylon's end shall come suddenly, "in one hour." Like a great millstone she shall be cast into the sea to rise no more. Now, the message is, "Babylon is fallen, is fallen [sentenced to destruction]. Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues" (Revelation xviii, 2-5).
