Our Monroe Prairie has been producing a cotton for years that has enabled Aberdeen to top the market and compete with the "Benders" of the lower valley, and this high station, so essential to profitable cotton growing, and that has advanced the market on all grades of Monroe county cotton can only be maintained by careful seeding.—Aberdeen Examiner.
