WHO MAY PRAY AND WHO MAY NOT

Prayer Is Not a Duty, but an Inestimable Privilege, Says Pastor Russell.

Sinners May Approach Him Only in the Appointed Way—"No Man Cometh Unto the Father but by Me." Formalistic Prayer Valueless—Public Prayer—Private Prayer—Family Prayer—Prayers Which Never Ascend to God—Rejected Prayers—Prayers of Praise and Thanksgiving—Incense Before God—The Prayers of the Saintry Are Limited.

Springfield, Mass., July 13.—Today opens an eight day Convention of the INTERNATIONAL BIBLE STUDENTS ASSOCIATION. The attendance is large. Pastor Russell was one of the speakers today. We report his discourse on Prayer, from the text, "Mine House shall be called an House of Prayer for all people."—Isaiah 56:7.

The Pastor said: These words applied to the Jewish Temple, which in turn was typical of the Spiritual Temple of the future. The antitypical Temple has not yet been built. St. Peter describes it as the Church in glory, whose chief Corner Stone is Christ, and whose living stones are the saints of God, now being chiseled and polished for places in that Temple.

As the stones of Solomon's Temple were all completed before the construction was begun, so the Church of Christ will be constructed at the end of this Age, after all the "living stones" shall have been fitted for glory. This will be accomplished by the power of the First Resurrection—"changed in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye"; for "flesh and blood cannot inherit the Kingdom of God."

As in the type, so the finished antitypical structure will be followed by Divine recognition. The Temple will be filled with the glory of the Lord, and thus marked as His dwelling place forever. Thus will be established—very soon, we trust—God's antitypical House of Prayer, wherein and whereby all mankind may come into fellowship with His Creator and have communion with Him through His appointed agencies.

Only Consecrated Priests Pray.

When I refer to consecrated priests, said Pastor Russell, do not misunderstand me to mean the clergy of any or all denominations. The Bible recognizes no clerical class, but declares, "All ye are brethren. One is your Master, even Christ." (Matthew 23:8). For eighteen centuries God's work in the world has been to call out a Royal Priesthood class. Jesus, their High Priest, was first called to suffering and then to glory; and His footstep followers have done the same. Through this Royal Priesthood the world will, in the future, have access to God.

Wrong Views Respecting Prayer.

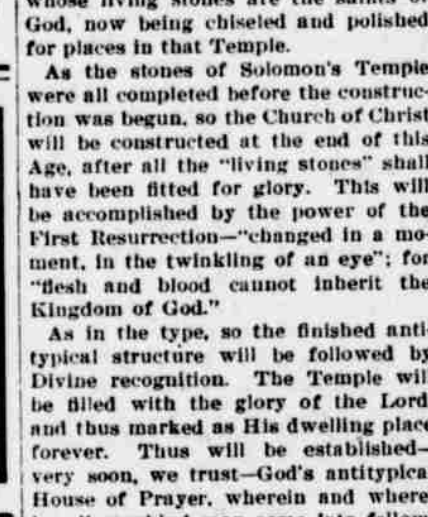
Pastor Russell then showed conclusively that nearly all have discerned the subject of prayer very indistinctly. Sinners have been urged to pray; moralists, who have never accepted Christ as their Savior, have been chided for not praying. The impression has been given that God is very anxious to be approached by anybody at any time. This the Pastor declares is a mistake. As no one would think of rushing informally into the presence of an earthly potentate, so none should expect to enter the Divine Presence without preparation, and to ask Heavenly favors with selfishness more or less filling the heart.

God has a special arrangement whereby His consecrated people may approach Him. "We (the Royal Priesthood) have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the Righteous," writes the Apostle John. But before the Redeemer will become Advocate for any, certain terms must be complied with. He serves only those who become His disciples. None others have any assurance whatever of Divine supervision of their affairs, or any authority for coming to God in prayer.

The Pastor stated one exception to this Divine rule. The children of consecrated parents have a standing before God through their relationship to their parents. But this standing manifestly terminates shortly after the child reaches a personal knowledge of its responsibilities. Thereupon it must make a personal covenant with the Lord, or else have its standing with the remainder of the world.

That standing, the Pastor reminded his hearers, does not mean liability to everlasting torment. It means alienation from God and His special providences in the present time; for the Divine arrangement is for the ultimate blessing of Adam and all of his posterity through the Messianic Kingdom.

The Pastor concluded by declaring that the truth on this subject may bring many indifferent ones to the point of decision and thus greatly benefit them. He believes that many Christians are asleep, and should be awakened to realize that they are trisling with the Gospel call. Such may awake to find themselves forever outside the High Calling and the privileges of the Church.



PETRIFIED FALLS IN ALGERIA

Remarkable Mineral Formation Which Puzzles Scientists Called "The Bath of the Damned."

With all the beauty of a cataract of living water, there is in Algeria a remarkable petrified waterfall which recently has been engaging the attention of scientists.

This is the Hammam-Meskutin, which means "The Bath of the Damned," and is located 62 miles from Constantine, on the site of the ancient town of Cirra. This solidified cascade is the production of calcareous deposits from sulphurous and ferruginous mineral springs, issuing from the depths of the earth at a temperature of 95 degrees Centigrade.

"The Bath of the Damned," even from a near viewpoint, looks for all the world like a great wall of water dashing into a swirling pool at its foot, yet its gleaming, graceful curves and the apparently swirling eddies at its base are as fixed and immovable as if carved from the face of a granite cliff.

Many centuries have, of course, gone to the making of the deposits, and the springs were well known to the ancient Romans. The name Hammam-Meskutin was given to the stone cataract in an allusion to a legend that the waterfall was petrified by Allah, punishing the impiety of unbelievers by turning all the members of a tribe into stone. At night, so the story runs, its stone dwellers of the remote past are freed from their strange fetters, come to life and resume their normal shapes.

Liquor Cause of Tragedy

Tramp Tells Philanthropist Harrowing Tale Illustrating the Fatal Effects of Whisky.

Philanthropist—Can you not from your own personal experience recall tragic deaths due directly to liquor? Tramp—I kin. One time me an' me partner, on a long an' weary journey—lookin' for work, ye know—found two big bottles of whisky. We each took one, an' we strapped 'em about our necks for convenience in carryin'. One Black Sheep Needed.

A revival of religion was in progress in a town where Peter, Paul and John were coal dealers. John was the first to come under the influence of very eloquent preaching. He was honest and sincere about it and joined the church. A week later Paul was influenced to abandon the world and the flesh, and he, too, became an enthusiastic supporter of the good work. Peter, however, held aloof from the meetings. None of the invitations of neighbors or brothers seemed to have any effect. Finally the clergyman called and made a personal appeal. Peter was rough and ignorant and a little inclined to profanity, but honest and frank in speech if not in act. He finally clinched his negative arguments with the clergyman when in reply to a question he said: "John has become a Christian and Paul has become a Christian and if I join your church who the—, excuse me, parson, will weigh the coal!"

Got in a Quiet Knock.

When Joaquin Miller, the Poet of the Sierras, edited the Eugene Register, he ran a joke column that is still remembered among Eugene veterans.

"Miller," said an aged Eugenist, "used to like to roast the coal man. Thus, I remember how, in a description of a wedding, he once wrote: 'The presents offered the bride were unusually sumptuous and abundant. Conspicuous among them was a ton of coal. This won general admiration and approval by reason of its quaint, old-fashioned massiveness, it being much heavier than the tons of coal of the present day.'

Lobsters That Do Not Boil Red.

Native French lobsters are growing scarce as the result of a series of epidemics, and an attempt is being made to introduce those from Roumania, Hungary and Russia. But these foreign lobsters have little flesh on them and turn a dull color when they are boiled.

To give them if possible the attractive scarlet tint, appetizing odor and delicious taste of the native Professor Leger is making researches in his laboratory of pisciculture in the University of Grenoble, and he hopes, in naturalizing the foreign species, to give them some at least of the French characteristics.

Welsh Descended From Noah.

The smaller a nation the longer the pedigree of the native. Thus every Scotoman of decent lineage is descended from the Bruce, every Irishman from the Red Kings and every Welshman from Noah. The last claim has been made for the family of the late Lord Tredegar. Cox, writing in 1890, when touring in Monmouthshire, wrote that "tacitful genealogists derived the origin of the Morgans from the third son of Noah," but that there was a division of opinion in favor of the first.
