BUT THAT OF THE DARK AGES

Jesus Promises to Destroy the Bible Hell-Why the Superstitious View of Hell Should Be Battered by All Lovers of Truth-The Bad Effects of the Error-Faith In True God Is Vanishing Because of This Colossal Error. No one but Jesus can do this. Hence we must wait for the appointed time-the establishment of the Messianic Kingdom. INSTRUCTIVE USES FOR FILMS IN SURGERY

What may be the means of saving many lives in the future, or at least of enabling young physicians to handle difficult cases more intelligently is the idea of using the moving picture films to demonstrate physiological and surgical facts. It does not take the knowledge of a physician to appreciate the wonderful possibilities of such a movement.

Two doctors at a meeting of the St. Louis Medical Society recently illustrated their talks by moving picture reels showing the circulation of the blood and the action of numerous baeilli. One of them, Dr. W. C. G. Kirchner, said: "Moving pictures can be used to replace vivisection for experimental purposes and for demonstration to students. They will be better able to investigate the methods of great surgeons if they can have a practical demonstration of their methods on canvas before them than if they merely are given a description. The time will come when the moving picture will become as much of a scientific necessity

as the microscope is today." Doctors who witnessed the illustrated lecture were enthusiastic over the possibilities of the moving picture film and the action of the bacteria on the sereen provoked much applause. Methods of inoculating different animals with disease germs were shown, as well as the condition of their blood after the germs had permeated their systems. Doctors claim that blood circulation can be better demonstrated by the picture film than by any other method.

Anti-vivisectionists will hear this news with great pleasure, for the use of live animals to teach students has been severely condemned in many quartera. With the establishment of the moving picture in place of live subjects, a complete victory for the "antis" may soon be expected.

Local schools have introduced the moving picture to portray different phases of their work and the results have been very gratifying.
